
THE BIG PICTURE



Introduction

Why do we experience both good and bad things in life? Family and friends, a scenic view, and a wholesome meal are all good things. But we also get sick, lose jobs, and hurt each other by our words and actions. What does the Bible say about good and evil? Here's a summary with green representing good and black representing evil.

God created everything.

According to the Bible, there's only one God. In the beginning God made all things. And everything God made was very good. Originally human beings had a close and special relationship with God.

We rejected God.

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Unfortunately, the first humans rejected God's authority. Their decision to live for themselves damaged their relationship with God and with each other. Selfishness and shame became a common human experience. While God responded with mercy, he also judged the first humans for their disobedience. As a result, we now only know life in a world of good and evil.

You may be thinking, "So why are we suffering for *their* sin?" We're not. The Bible says, "There is no one righteous, not even one" (Rom. 3:10 NIV) and "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Rom. 3:23 NIV). Like the first humans, we too are guilty before God.

God sent his Son.

Although God sent punishment into the world, his ultimate posture toward humanity was love. And because God wanted to repair our broken relationship with him, he sent his only Son into the world to save us. Two thousand years ago. God's Son was born into a Jewish family in Israel and given the name Jesus. Jesus taught people to turn back to God and love one another. And he demonstrated love by healing the sick and feeding the hungry.

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Jesus died for us.

Sadly, although Jesus only went around doing good he was rejected by the religious leaders in Israel. He was arrested, beaten, and then nailed to a cross where he died. For a time, evil seemed to defeat God's goodness. But on the cross, Jesus was paying the penalty for our disobedience.

Jesus conquered death.

Three days after Jesus died, the good news resounded "He has risen!" And during the next forty days, Jesus appeared to his followers and "gave many convincing proofs that he was alive" (Acts 1:3 NIV). Afterward he ascended into heaven and sat down at God the Father's right hand. Then Jesus' followers went out and spread the good news: "Jesus is alive" and "Jesus is Lord."


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


Life with Jesus
